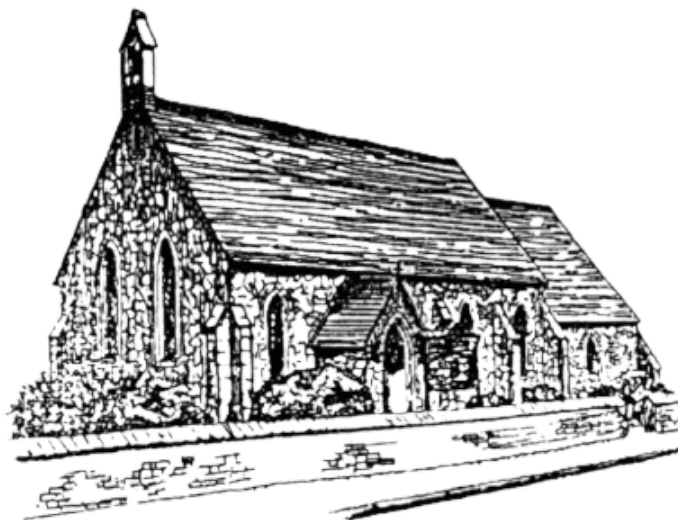

A Message from the Vicar

I came out of church yesterday after the Wednesday communion service (I'm writing this on 21 March) and it was as if I was entering a new world. The sun was out, it was warm and the months of wet and grey weather seemed past. It was only after this experience that I realised it was the official first day of spring – that day does not always exemplify the changing season so vividly! Later that day, in a farewell lunch for retiring Rector of Pyrford, Nick Aiken, we sat and ate and drank outside. It seemed like a marvel.

As I get older I seem much more aware of, and affected by, these seasonal changes. I felt like I too had a new lease of life. By the time you read this it will be after Easter Day and the church will be celebrating the springtime for the world which comes with the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Let's Recycle Printer Cartridges – 2024!

Please do start saving your old printer ink cartridges if you don't already!

A recycling company pays up to £1.75 per cartridge for the most common types of cartridge, like Canon and HP. The proceeds go to church funds and recycling also saves the cartridges from going to landfill, so a double benefit!

There is a container in the main halls foyer to the right of the doors into the Large Hall, and also in Claire's Café.

CARTRIDGES THAT WE CANNOT ACCEPT

We cannot accept the large toner cartridges, such as those shown below – these can be recycled at Martyrs Lane tip in a big red wheelie bin near the entrance. Or you may be able to return them to the manufacturer or seller that you bought them from.



Epson cartridges cannot be recycled in this country and need to be returned to The Netherlands! Pre-paid envelopes are available via this link:-

Supporting Mental Health and Wellbeing!

Have you ever heard of social prescribing? It is a service promoted by the council and GP practices that is taking a firmer and firmer hold in the community; in a nutshell it is about opening up all the opportunities in the area to support people's mental health and wellbeing.

Crouch Oak Family Practice (part of COCO Primary Care Network) and Runnymede Borough Council run art groups and wellbeing walks as well as support yoga in the community, a hub to encourage people to help each other and activities at Holme Farm in Woodham. 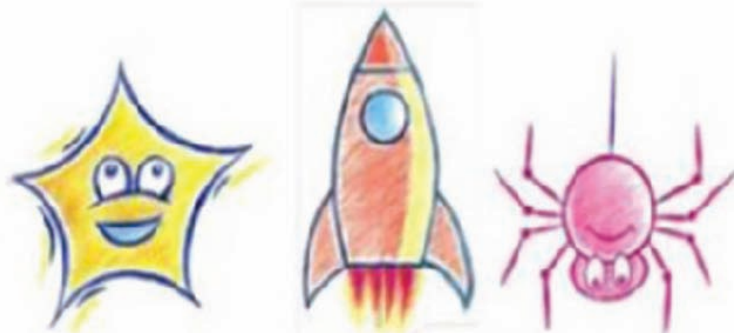
